Shoe Ice Cleats – your best friend for Winter Hiking

Removable ice cleats for your shoes are a great addition to your winter hiking gear. They greatly improve traction when needed (helping prevent falls) and can be removed and carried in your pocket when not needed. The brand I use is Yaktrax and they're usually available in local sporting goods and hardware stores in early winter, as well as online. Meet at 8:00 AM at Cracker Barrel in Morton if you want to carpool, otherwise meet at the lodge at 9:30 AM. The club will be bundling up and creating our own bald eagle watch/hike at Starved Rock. This is always a good time regardless of season or eagle appearances. There will be stairs on the trails. Weather and footing will determine the distance we take as options for the trails exist. Dress appropriately for cold temperatures. Wear boots and bring your hiking poles. If it is icy and you have some sort of ice cleats/spikes, bring them. Bring water, camera, trail snack, and binoculars as you wish. Leashed dogs are welcome. Afterward we will gather at the lodge for a luncheon for those interested.
