**Address**: 2510 Edgewater Dr., North Pekin, IL. Look for the 'Archery Range' sign to find the archery range/hiking trail parking lot.

*More specific directions*: From I-29, drive east (away from the river) on Edgewater Dr (IL-98) for about 1.6 miles. Look for the archery range sign on the north (left) side of Edgewater Dr (IL-98). Drive up the short/steep gravel road to the archery range / hiking trails parking lot. No rest rooms or water at the park. Dogs are ok.

Trails are moderately hilly, due to river bluff terrain. Trails also include some flat / meadow areas and a few water crossings (with bridges). All very nice indeed. I plan to hike about 1.5 to 2 hours and suggest bringing drinking water and hiking poles.

I visited there in mid-March. Spring leaves and wildflowers were just starting to emerge. Trails now include some posted trail map signs and improved bridges. All new since my last visit to the park. Thank you, mountain bikers and Pekin Park District.
